#### ARTIST BIOGRAPHY

Domingo Zapata was born in Palma de Mallorca, Spain in 1974. Named 'artist to watch' by *Whitewall Magazine* in 2011, his major public commissions include the Freedom Tower lobby in Manhattan, the Times Square vinyl mural (2019), the Colosseum in Rome, and the Plaza Hotel, New York. His work is held in significant private collections internationally.

#### ARTWORK DESCRIPTION

*Woman, Life, Freedom* is one of Zapata's most overtly political works — the Iranian flag's green, white, and red tricolour forming the background for his beloved panda character, who holds a red heart and wears a crown while the words 'Woman Life Freedom' are painted in bold black script across the composition. The slogan, which became the rallying cry of Iran's 2022 uprising following the death of Mahsa Amini, here acquires a new register through Zapata's signature Pop iconography — the innocence and universality of the panda figure amplifying rather than softening the political message. The work demonstrates Zapata's capacity to engage with urgent global events through his established visual language, giving the political statement an emotional accessibility that pure protest art rarely achieves.

#### CURATORIAL NOTES

*Woman, Life, Freedom* is the most politically charged work in the Zapata grouping and one of the most culturally significant in the collection. Its combination of immediate political resonance, Zapata's established market position, and the universally legible visual language of the panda series gives it exceptional collector appeal across cultural contexts.

#### ADDITIONAL NOTES

**Market Context:** Zapata's politically engaged works occupy a premium segment of his market, combining the accessibility of his signature Pop style with heightened cultural significance. Direct artist provenance with Certificate of Authenticity.
